

Your application will be reviewed for completeness and to determine your admission eligibility. Complete the application requirements carefully because incomplete packets will not be considered.

Cohorts of no more than 25 junior-level teacher candidates will be admitted, beginning each fall semester.

Admission Requirements

Potential teacher candidates are advised to begin the application process in late January. Application packets are due to the School of Education Department Chair by **March 1**. Incomplete and/or late application packets will not be considered. Potential candidates must meet the following requirements:

1. Completion of an Associates of Science Degree with an emphasis in Para-Professional Education, a cumulative GPA of 2.8 or higher, and a "C" or better in all required courses;
2. Successful completion of the Pre-Professional Skills Test (PPST) in the content areas of reading, writing, and mathematics prior to program application. The required score for each content area is 170 or higher, or passing one content area with a score of 170 and a composite score of 500. Test scores must accompany the ETEP Application, more details can be found on page 4;
3. Submission of a written vision statement indicating a commitment to teaching and an educational autobiography (These two documents are completed in EED 101 Intro. to Education. They should be updated and carefully edited.);
4. Completion of twenty documented classroom observation hours. (This is usually completed in EED 101 Intro. to Education.);
5. Submission of two letters of recommendation – one from a Haskell faculty member and one from the community in which the candidate officially resides;



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6. Evidence of strong ethics and moral conduct by maintaining good social standing on-campus and completing a felony disclosure statement;
7. Completion of a personal interview session and recommendation for program entry by the SOE Interview Committee. (See SOE Interview Committee selection for more details.)

Application Procedure

Admission to Haskell

Prior to application, potential teacher candidate must be admitted to Haskell Indian Nations University.

- Transfer students with an associate's degree from another university must submit all college transcripts to School of Education prior to application. The dean of the school will complete a transcript evaluation and confirm eligibility recommendations and advisement.
- Former Haskell students who have not been enrolled at Haskell for one or more semesters must meet all admission criteria prior to application for readmission.

Minimum 2.8 GPA Required

Potential teacher candidates must have a minimum of 2.8 GPA based on all course work completed from Haskell and transfer institutions. All required courses must be completed with a grade of "C" or higher.

Application Packet

A complete application packet consists of the following documents:

- Admission Application
- PPST scores submitted to SOE
- Official Transcript for all colleges/universities



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- A vision statement that indicates commitment to teaching.
- Signed felony disclosure statements
- Two letters of recommendation (faculty member and member of the community in which the candidate officially resides)

SOE Interview Committee

Program applicants applying for admission to the ETEP must complete a personal interview and be recommended for program entry by the SOE Interview Committee. The committee consists of five members: a classroom teacher from a local elementary school, an elementary principal from a local elementary school or a school district representative, the Dean of Professional Schools, a SOE faculty member, and a staff member representing Haskell Indian Nations University.

During the interview session, the potential teacher candidate will be asked to share information and respond to questions related to the following categories: 1) Commitment to Teaching, 2) Experiences with Children, 3) Personal Characteristics, 4) Academic Strengths and Areas for Growth, and 5) Cultural Awareness and Diversity. Potential teacher candidates also receive ratings on five Leadership Qualities displayed during the interview session – communication, self-reflection, openness, responsibility/reliability, and professional presence.

Each committee member rates the potential teacher candidate's responses using a 3 point rubric scale. Members of the interview committee submit their scoring sheets and written comments and recommendation to the Dean. The Dean will calculate an average score for each category and leadership quality. Potential teacher candidates are required to receive an average score of 2 (or higher) in each area to be eligible for program entry. The Dean may use discretion with regard to exceptions to the minimum score. If necessary a potential teacher candidate may be granted a second interview.

Notification of Admission

Potential teacher candidates will receive an official notification of their ETEP status within 10 working days following the interview. The Dean will also meet with each candidate to review the results of the interview and discuss program requirements and success.

Appeal Process

Potential teacher candidates who are declined admission to the ETEP may submit an appeal letter within five working days of such notification to the Dean of Professional Schools, Haskell Indian Nations University, 155 Indian Avenue Box 5014, Lawrence, KS 66046-4800. The Dean will review the letter and respond to the candidate regarding admission appeal status.

Pre-Professional Skills Test (PPST)



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Potential teacher candidates must successfully complete the Pre-Professional Skills Test (PPST) in the content areas of reading, writing and mathematic before application to the program (sophomore year). Information about the test can be obtained at www.ets.org/praxis. The required PPST scores are 170 for each content area. Or a candidate may pass one content area with a score of 170 and a composite score of 500. Candidates must record scores in the designated section of the ETEP application. Candidates will not be interviewed if PPST scores are not recorded or the tests have not been taken. The department chair must receive an official copy of the candidate's score from the Educational Testing Service (ETS). The code is **R6262** for Haskell. Candidates failing to indicate this code will be subject to an additional fee through ETS.
